- 2.1 Important supplemental information to provide on first alarm assignments includes, but is not limited to the following:
- Number of calls being received on fires
 - Specific occupancy information
 - Specific information on actual fire location
 - Rescue potential and number of injured
 - Fire exposure problems
 - Specific information on any chemicals involved
 - Assignment of a tactical radio channel for the incident
- 2.2 Essential medical information that should be provided on medical aid incidents includes:
- Age
 - Sex
 - Chief Complaint
 - Significant change in patient condition
 - Multiple patients
 - Level of consciousness if other than alert, such as altered and unresponsive.
