5.0 FIRE DRAWDOWN GUIDELINE

- 5.1 The REDCOM Duty Officer or REDCOM supervisor shall initiate resource move-ups in the event of resource drawdown due to large scale incidents (2nd alarm or greater) or depletion due to mutual aid resource deployments.
 - 5.1.1 The notification of drawdown or request to implement shall be made by REDCOM supervisor
 - 5.1.2 When requested by company or chief officer
- 5.2 Resource drawdown thresholds and station coverage assignments to be determined by individual regions
 - 5.2.1 Stations to be covered and apparatus type should be pre-determined by each region to address the regional needs and response requirements.
- 5.3 A region Chief may alter the drawdown plan for their region
 - 5.3.1 Based on available resources or up-staffed stations
 - 5.3.2 Specific needs or pending circumstances
 - 5.3.3 Providing communication with the chief or duty officer of each agency within their region
- 5.4 Each Region will identify a station(s) that will be designated a must cover station in order to meet regional response needs.
 - 5.4.1 Geographically located to best meet response standards
 - 5.4.2 Providing appropriate apparatus (Type 1 engines unless otherwise specified)
