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- 6.7 CAL Fire uses a statewide identification scheme with an ICS designator for resource types (such as engine) and a four-digit number. The first two digits of the number represent the Ranger Unit of the assigned resource, and the last two digits are an assigned unit number for that resource. Resources in the Sonoma-Lake-Napa Unit are assigned 1400 series numbers.
- 6.8 Santa Rosa Fire Department uses a system with an ICS designator for resource types (such as engine or truck) and a one of two-digit number to identify the resource.
 - 6.8.1 Front line apparatus: number of stations assigned (potentially 1-19).
 - 6.8.2 Front line second-out staffed apparatus: the numeral 2 is added in front of the station number (potentially 21-219).
 - 6.8.3 Reserve apparatus: the numeral 3 is added in front of the station number (potentially 31 through 319).
 - 6.8.4 Staff identifications for Santa Rosa Fire Department use the four-digit county numbering scheme.
- 6.9 Chief Officers, company officers, staff personnel and ambulance personnel shall utilize their unit resource identifier no matter whether they are on the unit radio or a portable radio. For example, the captain on Engine 1 is always "Engine One." If other personnel on a company have portable radios or utilize the unit radio separately from the company officer, they shall use the following identifiers:
 - 6.9.1 Driver/Operator: "Pump" (e.g. "Pump 7280")
 6.9.2 Engine Firefighter: "Portable" (e.g. "Portable 7280") An alpha designator may be used when it is necessary to identify multiple engine firefighters on the same company (e.g. "Portable 6" and "Portable 6A").
 6.9.3 Truck Firefighter: "Truck_Portable" (e.g. "Truck 1 Portable")
 6.9.4 Truck Tractor Driver: "Truck_Utilties" (e.g. "Truck 1 Utilities")
 - 6.9.5 Truck Tiller Drive: "Truck_Entry" (e.g. "Truck 1 Entry")

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- 6.10 Fire agencies may use a generic number to identify their Duty Battalion Chief or Duty Chief, such as "Battalion 72" for the Windsor Duty Battalion Chief or "Duty Chief 61" for the Geyserville Duty Chief.
 - 6.10.1 Two or more agencies that share Battalion Chief or Duty Chief's responsibilities within a single zone may use the zone number to identify the resource, e.g. "Battalion 7".
- 6.11 The radio identifier for the REDCOM Dispatcher is "REDCOM."
- 6.12 The radio identifier for the CRO shall be "Control" followed by the control channel number that the CRO is operating, e.g. "Control 2".
- 6.13 In order to maintain span of control REDCOM and/or Control Channel Operators may assign units to an alternate radio channel rather than the channel normally assigned to a specific jurisdiction. This may happen when a channel has become inundated with events or one major event. Units shall immediately switch to the newly appointed radio channel for any further transmissions.
